## FRENCH HEALTH AND INSURANCES

Subscription to the Student French Social Security: depending on your profile.

➤ Obligatory if you are less than 28 years old, if you come from a country not situated in the European Economic Area or Switzerland and if you stay in France more than 3 months.

> <u>Students belonging to the European Economic Area or Switzerland</u> must possess a European Heath Insurance Card, valid for the whole stay in France.

#### If they don't possess this card

- and are under 28: they must subscribe to the French student health insurance (215€ in 2015/2016).
- and are over 28: they must supply proof of private health insurance valid for the whole stay in France.
- > Students who are not part of the European Economic Area or Switzerland and who stay in France less than 3 months must subscribe to private health insurance which covers them in France for the whole duration of stay.
- > Students who are not part of the European Economic Area or
  Switzerland and who are more than 28 years old must supply proof of
  private health insurance valid for the whole stay in France. If they don't
  have personal insurance, they may obtain the CMU (Couverture Maladie

### Quebec students :

There is a reciprocity agreement between the French Social Security System and the Quebec Health Insurance (RAMQ) you must possess your health certificates and SE-401-Q-106 form and contact the closest CPAM (Caisse Primaire d'Assurance Maladie).

<u>NB</u>: We advise you to bring your health records.

Liability Insurance	Obligatory in France – covers the student during the whole stay in France in case of any damages caused to another person: <a href="http://vosdroits.service-public.fr/F2123.xhtml">http://vosdroits.service-public.fr/F2123.xhtml</a> The subscription of such an insurance may be done either in your home country provided that it is explicit (the covered period and home country have to be written) or as soon as you arrive in France. It costs less than 30€ for the academic year.  It is also recommended to be covered by private insurance which guarantees the payment of compensation in case of accident (leading to disability or death) and rapatriation.
Home Insurance	Home insurance must be provided to the hall residence secretariat (CROUS) – <b>to be subscribed to upon arrival in France</b> (about 30€/50€ per year).  Some owners also ask for this insurance.

HOUSING	
Hall Residences	Studio flats are available in our halls of residence in Arras and Béthune. Your application* for this kind of housing must appear on our online application form (available on April 2016). The number of rooms is limited and will be allocated first to the annual exchange students. The rent is about 260€* per month. The rent varies from 240€ to 280€/month.  Possibility to move in from Monday to Friday and between 9:00 -12:00 and 14:00 – 16:00 (except during annual closing).
	* You will be informed of the decision taken by our International Relations Office concerning your housing application in July (for a stay that starts on the first semester) and in December (for a stay during the second semester).
Housing in town	Some private owners propose furnished rooms, studios or flats for exchange students.  The monthly rent varies from 300€ to 350€.
