Dear students,

we invite you cordially to be a part of our new network summer school, April 7th-15th, 2017.

The Dialogue Project connects students and professors from Western Balkan universities with stakeholders and practitioners in refugee help as well as media representatives from countries involved in the Balkan refugee route. It builds upon results and resources from an intensive five-year cooperation in the DAAD research network "Trauma, Trust, and Memory" (2012-2016). Researchers, young researchers, and practitioners in refugee relief exchange perspectives and design intervention strategies.

One main goal of the dialogue is to advertise the fact that migration is connected to social trauma and cannot be handled without being aware of this context. Social trauma is often a main reason for migration. The experience of migration itself can be traumatic, and the specificity of how refugees are treated in the transit or target countries is often determined by the sociotraumatic history of the countries.

For the Dialogue School we welcome master and doctoral students from all relevant disciplines. Students of psychology and neighboring disciplines have the opportunity to attend the *International Masters Study Course Social Trauma*, accredited by all participating universities. Of course, students who do not want to attend this course can apply for the Dialogue School. They will have the opportunity to hear the plenary lectures and the dialogue workshops.

Admission

Admission for students will require:

- preparation of a short motivation letter (< 2 pages) accompanied by
- an abstract for your planned paper on a chosen topic in the context of social trauma and migration management in your respective country. Abstracts should be 300-600 words long and contain a short description of the topic of interest. The abstracts will be evaluated by two reviewers



from different countries, based on which the admission is going to be granted. Planned papers may be of different kinds:

- Analysis of the existing literature on social trauma and migration in a local context (psychological, social, legal aspects)
- Case studies from the local context
- Empirical research on any aspect of social trauma and migration etc
